CPAWS BC supports the position of the British Columbia Ministry of Environment and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada that fish passage should not be introduced at the Enloe Dam. This position was established on May 24, 2000 in a meeting between DFO, BC MoE, US Fish and Wildlife Service and US National Marine Fisheries Service, Colville Tribes, and Lower Columbia Tribes with regard to provision of fish passage at Enloe. It was mutually agreed that the idea of fish transfer did not have merit. Since then no additional evidence has been offered by a regulatory agency that would change this position, to the best of our knowledge.
